We recently began improving the acoustics in our new E.L.Wright Building studio space. Over \$600 worth of professional consultation time was donated to evaluate the existing acoustics and make recommendations that will help us use the space effectively. We have a two-phase plan in place. Phase I, at a cost of approximately \$1500, has already begun. Our new high-quality acoustical panels are making a big difference in sound quality and preventing noise overlap when more than one room is being used. Phase II (about \$3700) will depend on our ability to raise additional funds. CCSA will share the cost of the upgrades with Keweenaw Family Music, our partners in the studio. We are in need of additional funding to help pay off our Phase I investment and launch
